Role

Review of risk assessments.

Reporting

The position reports to the level 3 occupational health and safety committee constituted in the School of Medical Sciences.

Responsibilities

1. To be the point of contact within the School to receive information pertaining to risk assessments
2. To be the point of contact, in collaboration with the OHS Coordinator for the School, for members of the School seeking advice on risk assessments.
3. To be familiar with the UNSW Risk Assessment and Control Procedure, Risk Rating Procedure and the Risk Assessment and Control form.
4. To be familiar with the approval process for risk assessments and safe work procedures in the School of Medical Sciences
5. To contribute to the administrative review of risk assessments, checking that they are compliant with the OHS procedures and on the correct forms.
6. To assist the OHS coordinator in collecting the completed risk assessments for inclusion of information on the risk and hazard register.
7. To share information and liaise with the Chemical Safety Supervisor, Radiation Safety Supervisor or Biological Safety Supervisor, where appropriate.
8. To be able to direct enquiries on risk assessments to appropriate sources of information.
9. To assist in maintaining an awareness of the need for risk assessments within the School.
